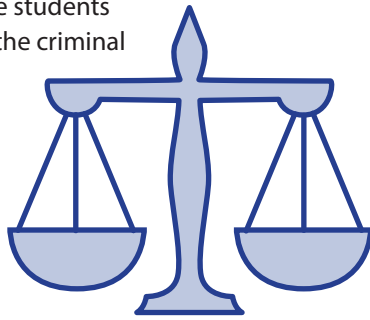

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROGRAM

OVERVIEW

This program is designed to prepare students for beginning professional work in the criminal justice and allied professions. Graduates understand the causes of crime and criminal justice system responses. An undergraduate criminology/ criminal justice degree serves as a strong foundation for advanced training, and prepares students for bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programs in social science, social work, counseling, and law.

CAREER OUTLOOK

Criminologists and criminal justice professionals investigate why crimes are committed, who is committing them, what type of societal factors might be contributing to higher crime rates, and the best ways to predict, deter, and prevent future crimes. Program graduates find employment with a variety of governmental (state and local) and private agencies that include the areas delinquency prevention, addiction prevention and recovery, prisoner reentry, confinement reform, immigration policy reform and enforcement, and law and penal systems operation.
