OVERVIEW

Social work is a helping profession. Social workers assess human problems and engage in problem solving. The social worker understands the process of individual development and the interaction with the social environment. The baccalaureate major in social work prepares generalist social workers at the undergraduate level for entry-level positions in social work and for graduate social work.

BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK (BSW) PROGRAM

Little Priest Tribal College

Students transferring into Briar Cliff University's Bachelor of Social Work program are required to have completed the Liberal Arts, Associate of Arts degree from Little Priest Tribal College with at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Little Priest Tribal College Liberal Arts, Associate of Arts students may begin Briar Cliff University's Bachelor of Social Work degree after completing 64 credits. Students from Little Priest Tribal College will need to complete 60 additional credits at Briar Cliff University in order to meet the graduation requirement of 124 credits.

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Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) Program

Minor and Concentrations

Students who transfer to Briar Cliff University's BSW program have the option of minoring in Gerontology and/or obtaining a concentration in 1. Behavioral Health and Addictions 2. Children, Youth, and Families 3. Faith-based Ministry. A concentration is a structured plan of study within a major. The minimum number of credit hours for an internal concentration is 12 credit hours. Credits for an internal concentration are in addition to the requirements beyond the core courses of the major. An internal concentration appears on the official transcript. To earn a B.S.W. with a concentration, students take all courses required for the B.S.W plus the courses required for the concentration.

Gerontology Minor

Developed by the nursing, psychology and social work departments, the interdisciplinary gerontology minor prepares students in any discipline to work with other people in a rapidly changing population. Students from all disciplines benefit from studies of the aging population. An interdisciplinary minor provides the vehicle for organized gerontological studies for any student in any of the academic programs.
