

This is a transfer guide for Iowa Lakes Community College associate degree in nursing students (ADN) transferring to Briar Cliff University's RN-BSN program. This guide outlines course equivalencies, degree requirements, and recommended coursework to ensure a seamless transfer process. By following a transfer guide, students can maximize credit transferability, minimize time to degree completion, and avoid unnecessary coursework.

Students need a minimum of 120 credit hours to graduate with a bachelor's degree from Briar Cliff University. At least 30 credit hours must be taken at BCU.
